

In a similar way, using the same sentence structure by repeating the same structure over and over again is also considered bad style. Conjunctive Adverbs - Conjunctive adverbs begin a sentence linking it directly to the sentence before. Place a comma directly after the conjunctive adverb. Examples The car was in need of repair. As a result, Peter took the car into the repair shop. It's very important to study grammar. Prepositions such as 'due to' or 'despite' can provide a similar meaning to a dependent clause. Examples Just like our neighbors, we decided to put a new roof on our home. Finally, when writing longer passages you'll be using linking words and sequencing to connect your ideas. As in word choice and sentence style, it's important to vary the linking language you use. If you use 'first, secondly, thirdly, finally' in one paragraph, switch it up and use 'to begin with, next, after that' in another paragraph.
